Initially the college was affiliated to Calcutta University, however, subsequently switched over to Burdwan University in the year 1962 and, at present, Bankura University from 01.01.2017

Code of Ethics Policy Document

1) Maintaining regular attendance by the students is the first and foremost criterion for a student to become eligible for appearing in the University examinations.

Following are the parameters in this regard :

75% of the total class attendance is must for appearing at the concerned semester examination.

Those students having class attendance between 60-75% of the total classes held are allowed to appear at the concerned University examinations, subject to the payment of prescribed condonation fees and fulfillment of the other conditions laid down in the regulations.

A student having class attendance below 60% of the total classes held, is not allowed to appear for the concerned semester examinations. He/She is to pursue admission to the same semester in the very next year for attending the classes and appearing in the said semester examinations.

[Such class attendance is calculated from the date of commencement of classes or date of admission whichever is later.]

2) If a student is absent for more than two weeks without prior permission/information, his/her name is likely to be struck off the register.

3) Science students, who do not attend the theory classes regularly, shall not be permitted to attend practical classes.

4) For being sent up for the University examination a student must pass the college examination.

If any student becomes absent on medical ground he/she must produce a Medical certificate before the end of the examination or within three (03) days of its completion, to the Principal. But unless the student's record is very good such case is not considered on sympathetic ground.

5) Students must use and display visibly their identity cards during the college hours inside the campus. In case of loss of identity card a duplicate can be issued with the permission of the Principal and on payment of a fine of Rs. 100/-.

6) If a student fails to clear the fees within the notified date, he/she will have to secure readmission on payment of full fees again with the prior approval of the Principal.

7) Students' conduct must be orderly and polite. They are expected to treat the members of the staff and their fellow students with courtesy both in and out of the college.

8) Students must enter into the classes at the beginning of each period. They are strictly prohibited to enter or leave the classroom without permission.

9) Proper care must be maintained while treating the college property, furniture and library books.

10) Rules of conduct of examination placed on the Notice Board must be strictly observed.

11) Impersonation at roll-call is a punishable offence.

12) For important announcements the students are required to check the notice boards.

13) Students must be formally and decently dressed within the college campuses.

14) Severe punishment or **disciplinary actions are taken against those students who are indulged in smoking, chewing tobacco products, playing card, spitting and loitering.**

15) Use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited within the college campus (except common rooms and the canteen) and a fine of Rs. 500/- is imposed on the users, if used in the college campus other than the permitted areas.

16) **Anti-Ragging Rules :-**

Guidelines from the **Supreme Court** and the **University Grants Commission** (Regulation 2013) are the main driving forces for curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions. Students are to abide by the anti-ragging rules that are in force in our campus. It is a punishable offence for indulging in or abetment of ragging and it may lead to expulsion from the college.

GREEN CAMPUS INITIATIVES

It has become an integral part of the modern day education system to follow the green campus initiatives. The educational institutions can act as pioneers in promoting these principles within society.

In order to support a sustainable and climate friendly environment a green campus program has been initiated by our college.

Environment awareness and education, the use of sustainable energy and energy efficient measures, comprehensive recycling and composting and green landscaping in the campus etc. are the main objectives of these initiatives.

Following are the practices of our college towards establishment and maintenance of green campus:-

Waste Management

- Solid waste coming from garden, canteen and hostels are managed by carrying out vermicomposting.
- E-waste management is outsourced.
- The Liquid waste generated in laboratories are treated and recycled.

Water Management

- Construction of rainwater harvesting system at the main campus of the college.
- Collection and recycling of the waste water for gardening and clearing purpose.
- To check unnecessary loss of water, regular inspection of taps and drainage system is made.

Tobacco free campus

- The campus has been made as no smoking zone.

Renewable energy

- Solar panels and solar light have been installed in the campus.
- Switching over to LED light (90%).

Green Landscaping

- The campuses have been made green landscaping with trees and plants.
- Tree plantations by the students and staff of the college.

Other Initiatives for Green campus of the college

1. Restricted entry of automobiles

Due to shortage of space inside the college premises, entry of all types of automobiles inside the premises has been restricted by the college authority. An automobile cum bicycle stand has been constructed near "Rabindra Chhatrabas" campus near the college building.

2. Use of Bicycles/Battery powered vehicles

College authority always promotes use of Bicycles or Battery operated vehicles by the staff and students. Nearly 90% of the student and 30% of the staff come to the college either by Bicycles or Battery operated vehicles.

3. Ban on use of Plastic

There is a complete ban on the use of non recyclable plastics, containers and other materials inside the college campus. Ecoclub of our college regularly monitors the above fact and guarantees the plastics which are used inside the campus are of permissible thickness as prescribed by the Government. Necessary notification has been made in this regard inside the college premises by the authority. Separate dustbins have been kept at several places inside the campus for disposing of the plastic wastes.

4. Landscaping with trees and Plants

College premises and the college attached student's hostel have been landscaped with several big trees like Debdaru (*Polyanthea longifolia*), Kaju (*Anacardia oxydentalis*), Mango (*Mangifera indica*), Bot (*Ficus benghalensis*) and other plants.

5. Seminars/webinars are arranged at regular intervals on environment pollution and remedial measures for the same by Eco-club and IQAC of the college.

- Green-audit is also made at regular intervals.

6. Special committee for Green campus

- A separate committee for Green campus or Eco-club is there in our college for monitoring various green campus initiatives.

Facilities for Differently abled (Divyangjan)

Providing equal opportunities to everyone including persons with disabilities is the constant aim of this college. It emphasizes to provide a conducive environment where all are included for participating in any college activity or not subjected to any kind of discrimination.

Following are the measures as taken by the college for differently abled persons:-

- Equal opportunities are ensured to differently abled students in various courses. As per the UGC guidelines a definite percentage of seats is reserved for them
- Scribe for writing exams (as per Bankura University guideline) are provided.
- Ramps and disabled friendly washrooms are provided at our main campus as well as new campus ensuring a barrier free environment for differently abled persons.

Special Feature :-

The College conducts CAT (Certificate in Accounting Technician) and ICWAI Course, by the institute of Cost and Works accountants of India, Durgapur Chapter.

FUTURE ACADEMIC VISION :

To create facilities for classical and modern faculties of study, the college authority always endeavours to seek approval from Bankura University and to provide with infrastructural facilities.

The College has a greater vision for the local knowledge - seeking people of the area by introducing more Post Graduate courses and relevant Certificate Courses after obtaining necessary permission from competent higher authorities.

Compulsory Subjects for Arts, Science and Commerce students are Modern Indian Language and Environmental Studies.

In addition to Test Examinations, Class Tests and Periodical Tests are also conducted by College with prior notification. Special importance is given to the results of these examinations to sit for the final examination.

The claim for retaining the Core Course shall stand cancelled without any notice if the attendance of such students of First Semester classes (Arts, Commerce and Science) of the first thirty teaching days falls below 75% in the particular Core subject.

A student will be declared non-collegiate or dis-collegiate if the attendance of such student falls below University norms (below 75% and 60% respectively.)

The Morning Section has been rescheduled.

75% Class attendance in compulsory for Semester Students for getting allowed in College Test Examination.

RULES OF ADMISSION :

- Eligibility for admission in general course (Arts / Science/Commerce) - Pass Marks in H.S. or Equivalent Examination and for Honours course 45% marks in aggregate and other & General conditions specific for different Subjects.
- Selection in Honours & Program courses will be made in order of merit. (Marks basis and through proper counselling).through **On-Line admission (Stand alone basis)**.
- There is provision for admission of students passing from vocational or agronomy subjects as per the University Guidelines.
- Application Form for Registration and admission (On-Line) can be filled up through the College Website (www.bankurasammilanicollege.net).
- A fees deposited at the time of admission will not be refunded under any circumstances.

GENERAL RULES :

- Incomplete applications will be cancelled forthwith.
- Application forms for Hostel admission will be issued on payment of Rs. 50/- per form on demand.
- Admission will be made strictly on the basis of merit and through proper counselling through On-line mode.
- For SC/ST/PH/OBC candidates seats are reserved as per Govt. Rules.
- Candidates found suitable for admission after proper counselling must get themselves admitted strictly on the specified date and time. No request for admission will be entertained after the expiry of the stipulated date and time.
- Admission in all classes will be made strictly according to seat capacity.
- Existing Honours students who did not appear at the Part-I Final Exam. and desiring to study Hons. Course again shall have to apply for admission in 1st Year Hons. Class as a fresh outside candidate.
- There may be provision for admission in Special Hons. Courses provided seats remain vacant in the department concerned.
- The entire process of admission is directed and supervised by the Teachers' Council and its Admission sub-committee, whose decisions will be final and conclusive. As per Bankura University statutes the Teachers' Council of the College is the supreme Body relating to admission.
- **Admission fees once deposited is not refundable.**

Three unit Tests for each class will be held as per regular notification in each semester. Result of Unit Tests and attendance will be considered as vital for UGC Stipend holders for getting further installments and for general students for appearing at the University final Examinations.(2nd Semester Examination)

Academic Facilities

1. LIBRARY

BankuraSammilani College Library, a learning Centre with knowledge resources predominantly related to general subjects. The library is a powerhouse of resources that generates knowledge, equipped with a good collection of books, magazines etc. The college library is enriched with a wealth of information in print format. The college campus has internet connectivity and Wi-Fi; Library has improved resources and holdings, built more floor space. The Library holds a rich collection of printed as well as online which include e-books, e-journals through INFLIBNET-NLIST(<https://nlist.inflibnet.ac.in>) Consortia. Access to the WEBOPAC is provided through the college website Portal or using this URL (<https://bsc-opac.kohacloud.in/>). The college library building is centrally located, well laid out, and aesthetically designed to make it an inviting place with the ambience that is suitable for learning and scholarship. Providing the right ambience for reading and reflection and the library has a reading room having 30 seating capacity for students at a time. There is a separate reading room in the library for teachers and a Digital Library for teachers and students. Value added induction programs are provided to the students, which help them to obtain diverse knowledge about upcoming technologies apart from academics, use of library resources, technologies etc. Library has close access to its collection for students and open access for faculties and staffs. Fire-fighting systems are installed inside the library.
